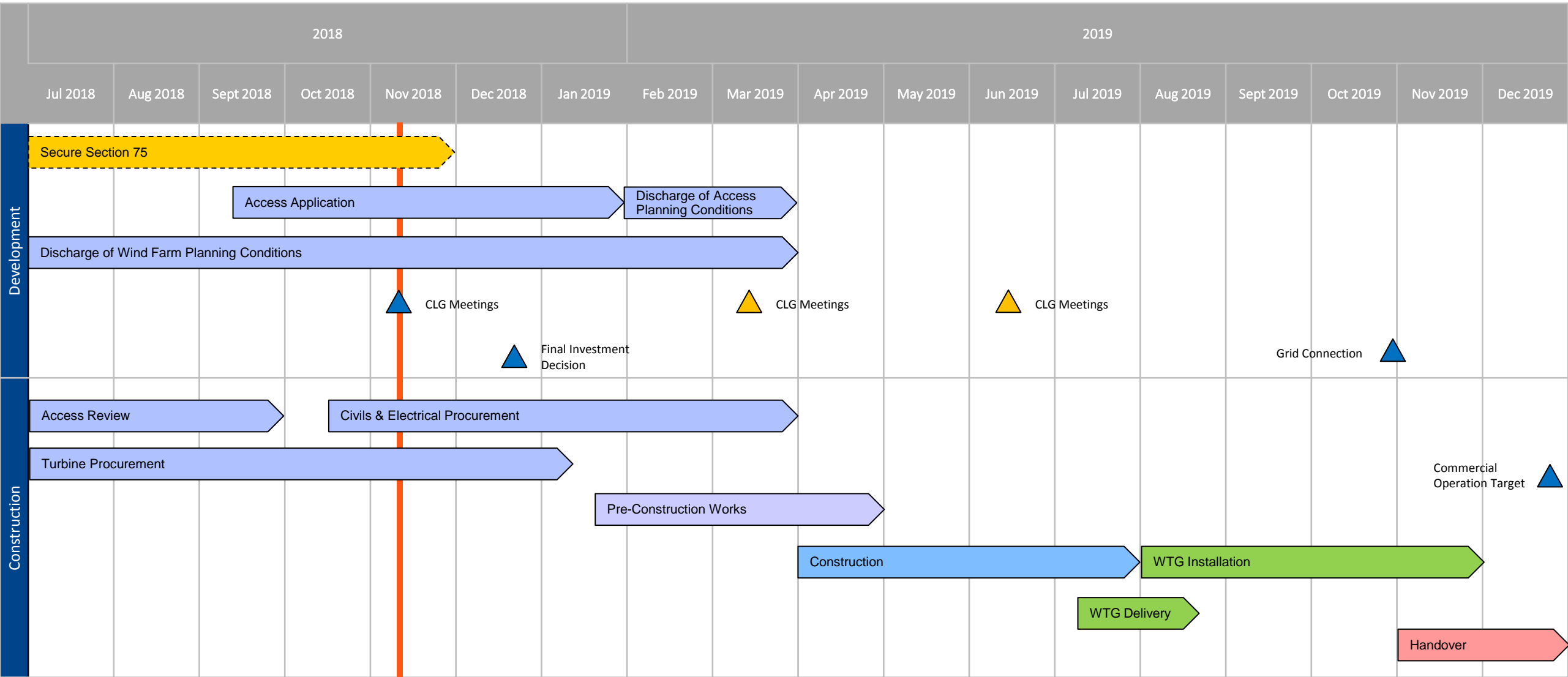

Wind Farm

- Status of Section 75 application
 - Section 75 – A planning obligation where a contract is entered into between a developer, the landowner and the planning authority, and generally relates to matters of ‘gain’
 - Burnfoot East S75 – Habitat Management Plan, Recreational Enhancement Fund, non-residential occupation of Backhills Farmhouse
 - Target completion, end November 2018
- Ongoing Work & Planning Conditions
 - Application for access modifications lodged with Perth & Kinross Council (ref: 18/01929/FLL)
 - 26 wind farm planning conditions – TMP, HMP, ECMP, PMP, WQM, Bond, etc.
 - Access planning conditions – TBC (decision expected ~ January 2019)
- Timescales/Project Schedule (subject to change)
 - Commencement of Construction – April 2019
 - Delivery of Component Parts – July/August 2019
 - Erection of Turbines – August 2019
 - Commissioning – November/December 2019
 - First Commercial Export – January 2020

- Application submitted to Perth & Kinross for road widening and slope stabilisation works at the bridge below Backhills Farm to facilitate the delivery of larger turbine component parts
- Application registered (ref: 18/01929/FLL) on 25th October 2018
- Local application
- Consultations have been issued
- Statutory determination period of 8-weeks
- Target decision date January 2020

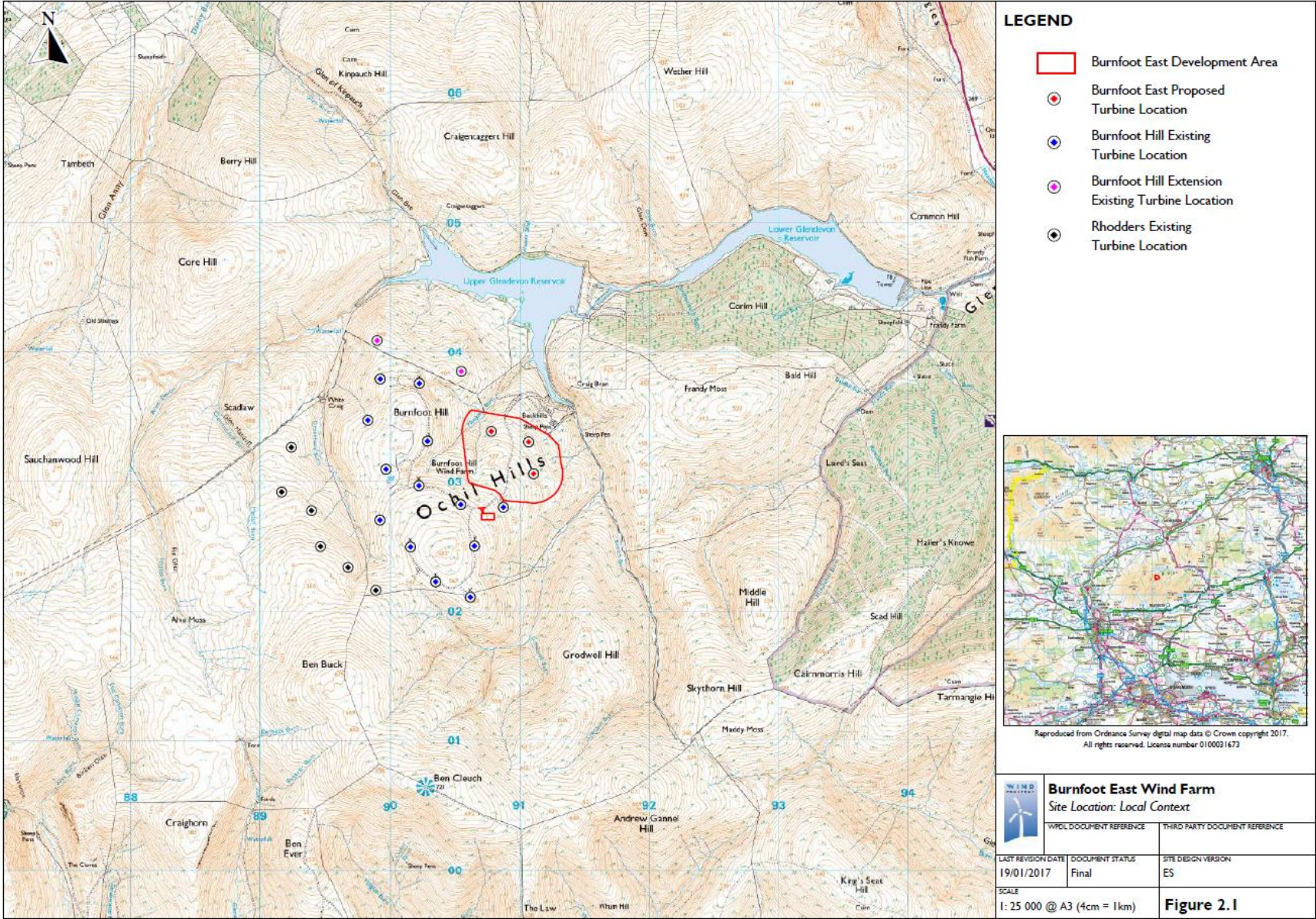

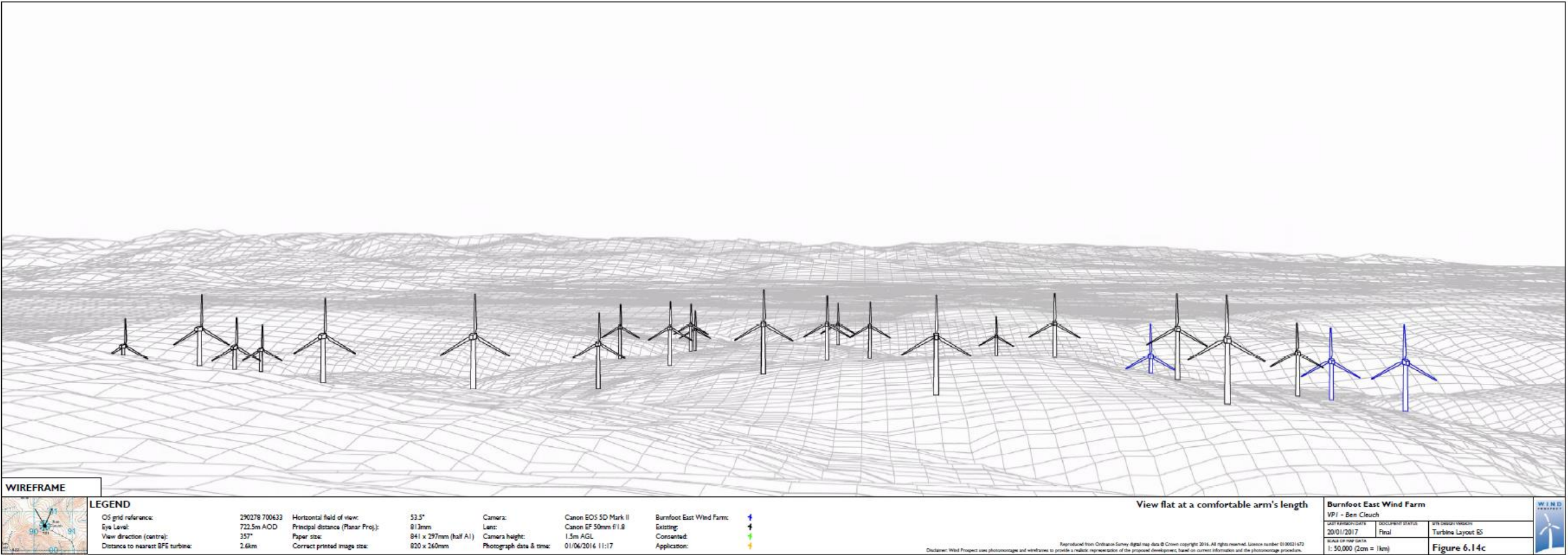

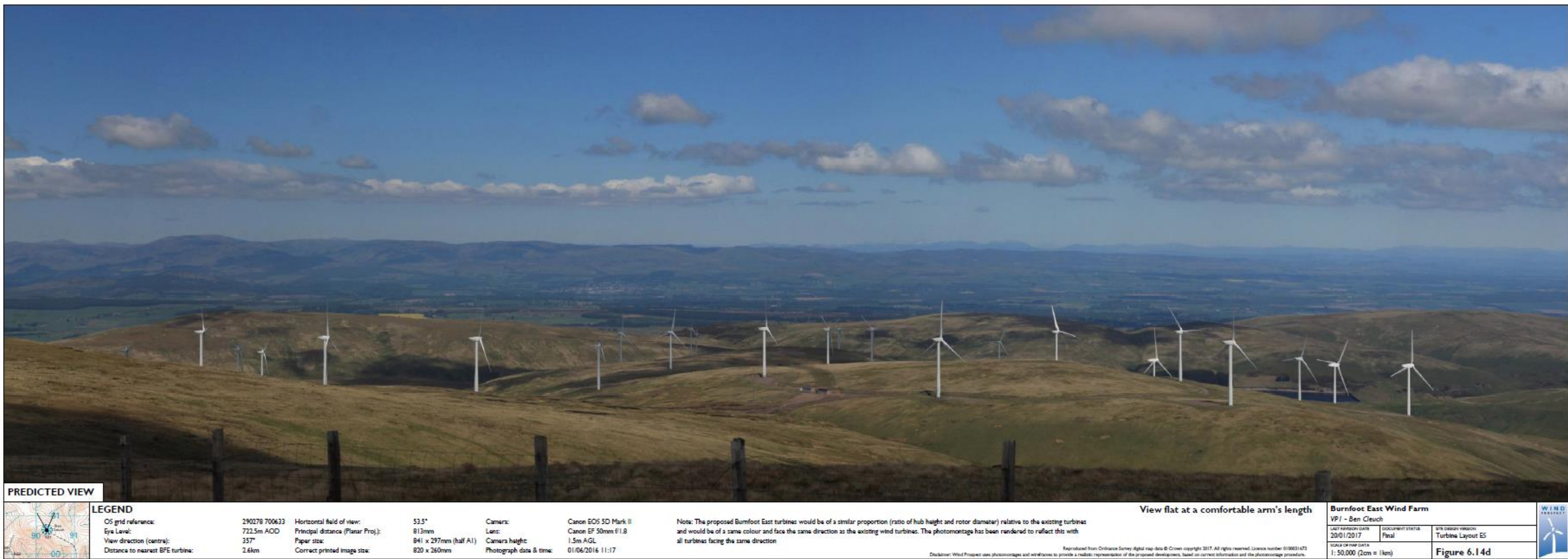
Site Layout



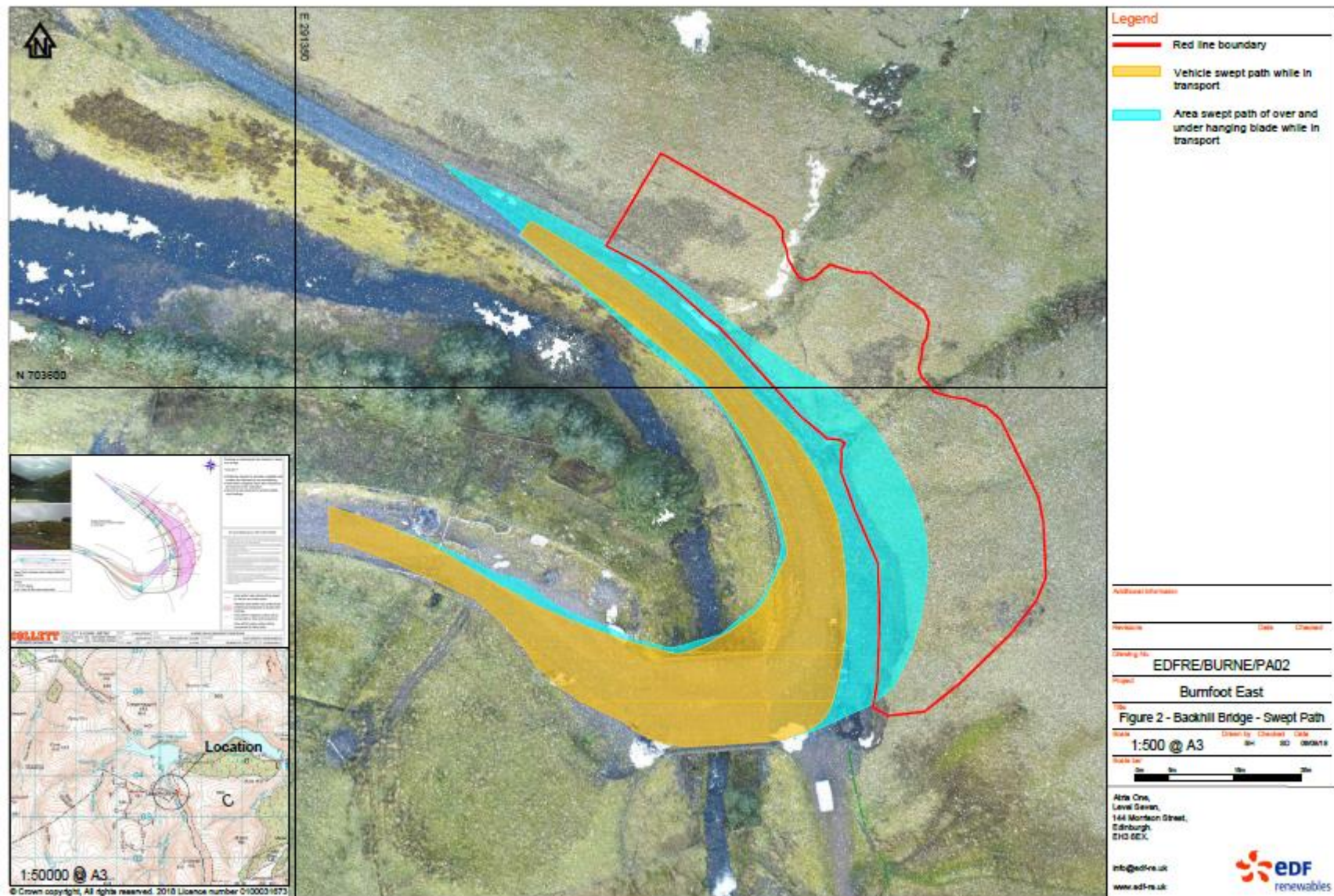
